COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 2008/114/EC

of 8 December 2008

on the identification and designation of European critical infrastructures and the assessment of the need to improve their protection

(Text with EEA relevance)

DEFINITION:

‘European critical infrastructure’ means CI located in MS the disruption or destruction of which would have a significant impact on at least two MS. The significance of the impact shall be assessed in terms of cross-cutting criteria. This includes effects resulting from cross-sector dependencies on other types of infrastructure;

Five pillars to tackle the challenges:

- (1) Preparedness and prevention: to ensure preparedness at all levels;
- (2) Detection and response: to provide adequate early warning mechanisms;
- (3) Mitigation and recovery: to reinforce EU defence mechanisms for CII;
- (4) International cooperation: to promote EU priorities internationally;
- (5) Criteria for the ICT sector: to support the implementation of the Directive (ECI)



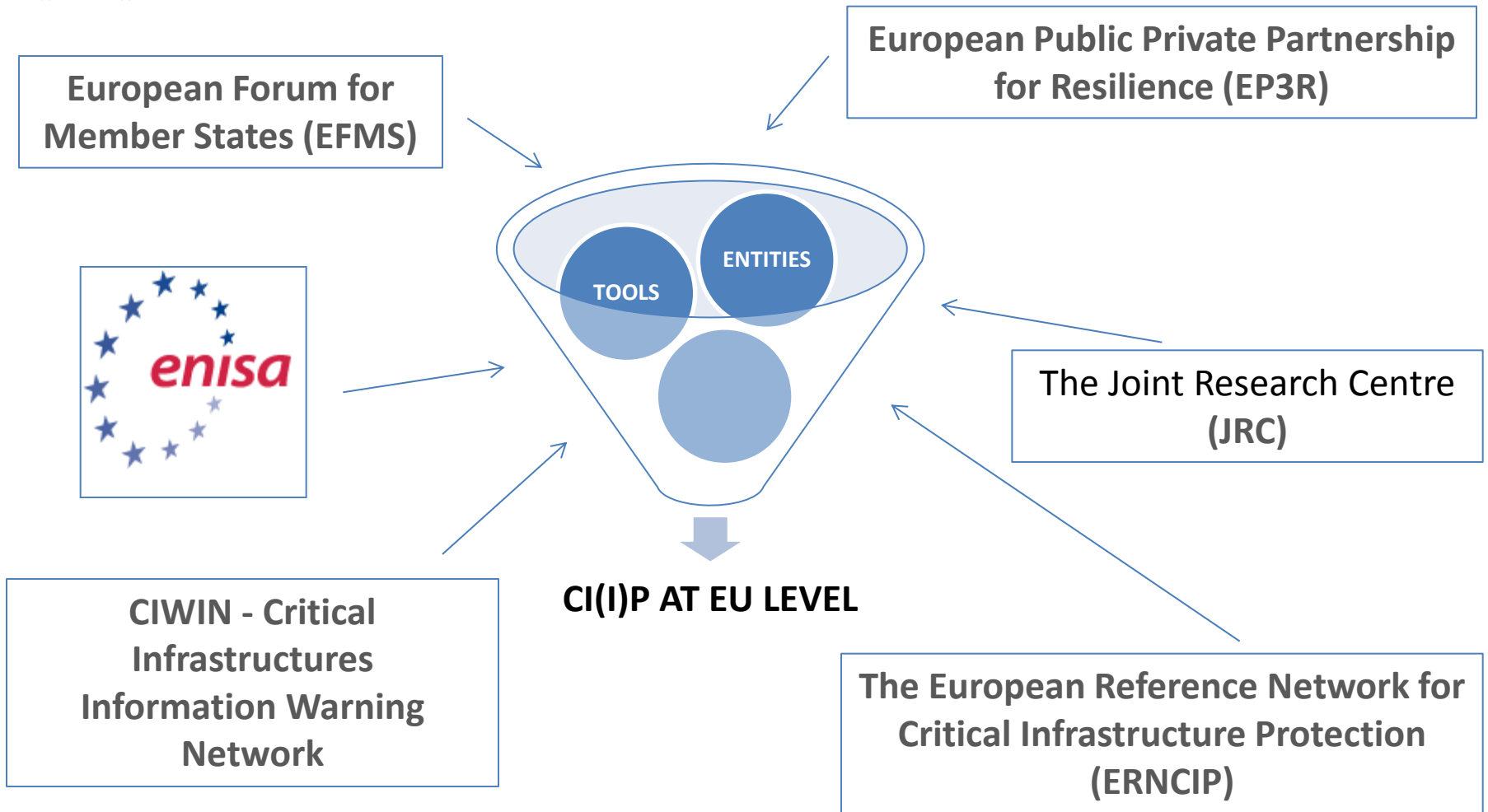

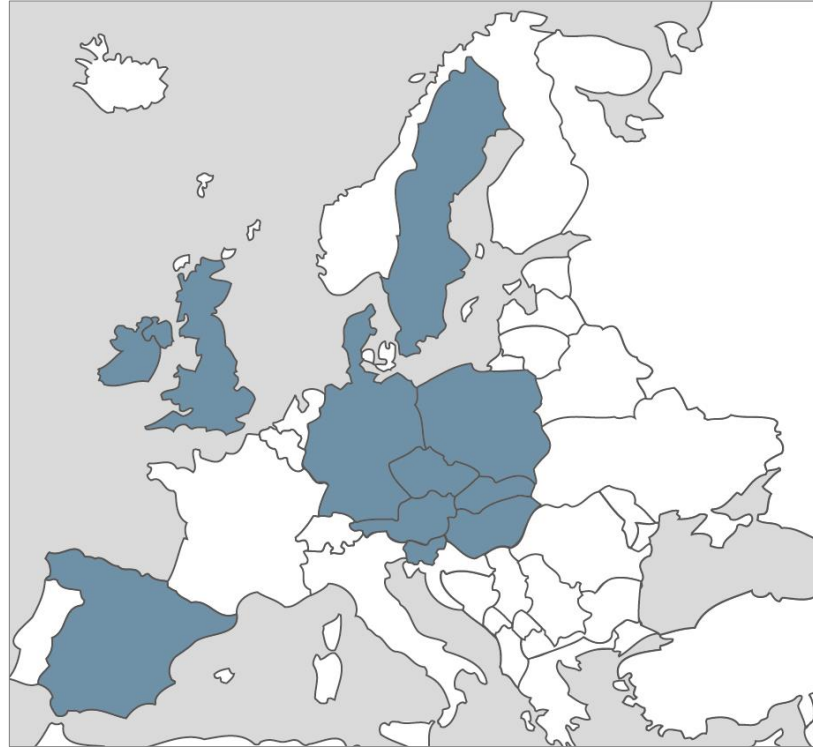

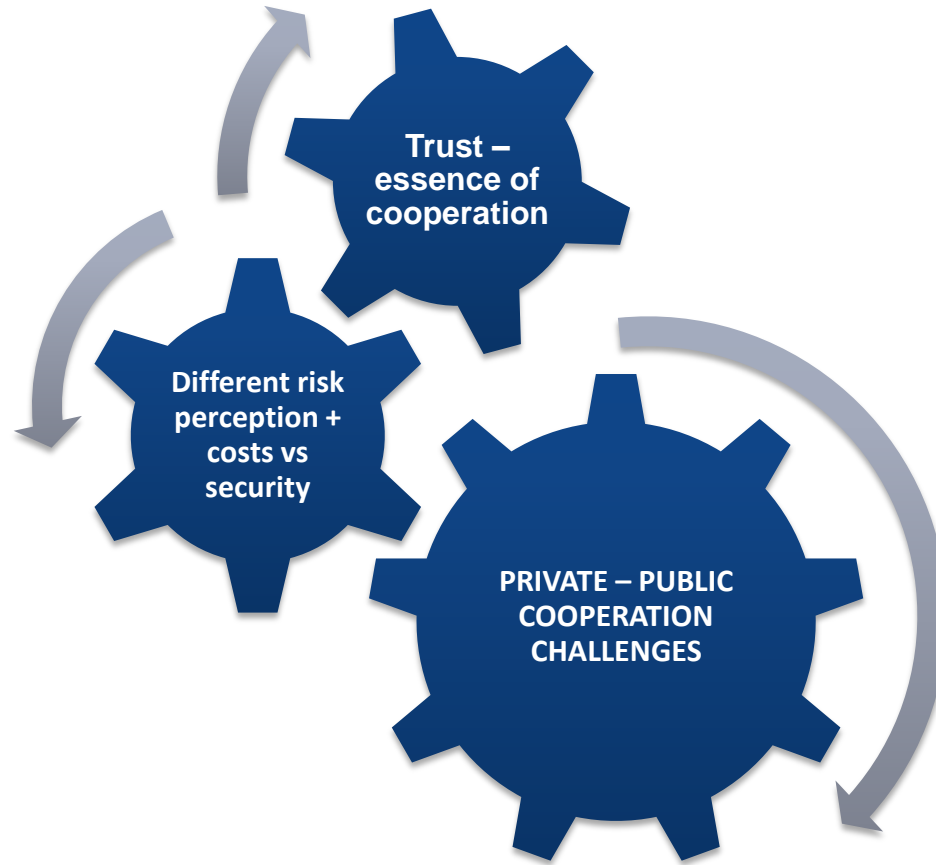
